Pursuant to the Court's direction (Order dated May 15, 2013 (ECF Doc. 774) counsel for all parties to this lawsuit have conferred and now state the following:

### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, on March 27, 1963, Plaintiff Jessie Short filed a lawsuit against the United States of America (the "Defendant") in the United States Court of Claims (ECF Doc. 1) and this lawsuit is currently captioned *Jessie Short, et al. v. United States of America, et al.*, No. 63-102 (Fed. Cl.) (the "Lawsuit");

WHEREAS, the Hoopa Valley Tribe ("Tribe") intervened in the Lawsuit as a

Defendant-Intervenor;

WHEREAS, on July 29, 1993, the Court awarded to each qualified plaintiff a Final

Judgment;

WHEREAS, the Final Judgments awarded were affirmed by the United States Court of

Appeals for the Federal Circuit in *Short v. United States*, 50 F.3d 994 (Fed. Cir. 1995); and

thereafter, on May 5, 1995, the Federal Circuit's mandate was returned to the Clerk of Court for

the United States Court of Federal Claims;

WHEREAS, on December 21, 1995, the Court entered the Order re: Disbursements,

Deposits and Payment of Judgments (ECF Doc. 30);

WHEREAS, on or about January 9, 1996, Heller, Ehrman, White & McAuliffe, by

Robert S. Venning, Counsel of Record for the Plaintiffs, and Citicorp Trust, N.A. entered into

the Court-approved 1996 Trust Agreement which created the Short Judgment Trust to receive,

hold, and disburse pursuant to the Court's orders, the monies paid by the U.S. Treasury and the

monies earned on the Trust fund's investments;

WHEREAS, the 1996 Trust Agreement was periodically amended and the amendments

were periodically approved by the Court;

WHEREAS, on or about January 10, 2009, Plaintiffs and Citibank, N.A. entered into the

"Amended and Restated Short Judgment Trust Agreement;"

WHEREAS, periodically disputes arose between Plaintiffs and Citibank vis-a-vis the

Short Judgment Trust;

WHEREAS, on or about April 13, 2012, Citibank transmitted to the Court and to all of

the parties in the Lawsuit, the Trustee's Report re: disputed checks that were identified in

Defendant's Jessie Short Judgments Verification Reports (Dec. 2005);

WHEREAS, Defendant United States issued subpoenas and subpoenas duces tecum to

Citibank and its paying agents seeking deposition testimony and documents related to Citibank's

administration and management of the monies held or earned in the Short Judgment Trust and

the matters addressed in the April 13, 2012 Trustee's Report:

WHEREAS, on or about, June 21, 2012, Citibank filed a Motion to Intervene for the

limited purpose of resolving any and all Short Judgment Trustee's responsibilities, duties, and

liabilities;

WHEREAS, on June 26, 2012, the Court granted Citibank's Motion to Intervene (ECF

Doc. 677);

WHEREAS, John W. Corbett, Plaintiffs' Counsel of Record is the Court-approved

representative of all Plaintiffs and the Court has determined that Mr. Corbett has full authority to

negotiate and approve any settlement negotiated with the attorneys who represent Citibank;

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2013, the Court held a formal settlement conference which

was attended by attorneys representing Plaintiffs, Defendant United States and Citibank in the

Chambers of the Honorable Lawrence S. Margolis, Senior Judge, United States Court of Federal

Claims;

WHEREAS, Plaintiffs' counsel and counsel for Citibank reached an agreement in

principle at the March 15, 2013 settlement conference;

WHEREAS, Plaintiffs were informed of their rights to object to the proposed settlement

and they were invited to attend a fairness hearing in the Lawsuit that was held on April 3, 2013;

WHEREAS, the Court conducted the Fairness Hearing on April 3, 2013 and at that time,

no objections were voiced to the proposed settlement;

WHEREAS, the Court determined that the proposed settlement is fair; and

WHEREAS, in order to avoid the possible costs, burdens and distractions of litigation,

the Plaintiffs and Citibank entered into a Settlement Agreement to resolve fully and completely

any and all disputes, claims, issues and differences between Plaintiffs and Citibank related to the

Short Judgment Trust.

**STIPULATION** 

1. Plaintiffs and Citibank each stipulate that they will respectively execute the Settlement

Agreement no later than Tuesday, June 4, 2013.

2. Citibank stipulates that, if the Plaintiffs have executed the Settlement Agreement by June

4, 2013, all monies payable under the Settlement Agreement will be paid into the Short

Judgment Trust no later than Tuesday, June 18, 2013.

3. No later than Wednesday, June 19, 2013, Citibank will transfer all of the monies in the

Short Judgment Trust to the new Trustee (Comerica Bank/Comerica Bank & Trust, N.A.

xxx2825), provided that: (a) Comerica Bank/Comerica Bank & Trust, N.A. has provided wire

and asset transfer instructions; (b) certain bonds held in the trust may require additional

processing time; and (c) such transfers are subject to a reasonable reserve for payment of

reasonable expenses and taxes.

4. The parties stipulate that all claims against Citibank which were raised or could have

been raised in the instant case will be voluntarily dismissed with prejudice effective June 28,

2013.

5. The parties stipulate that effective June 28, 2013 Citibank is terminated as Trustee for the

Short Judgment Trust, unless terminated earlier by agreement of Plaintiffs and Citibank and the

approval of the Court.

6. The parties request that the lawsuit be finally closed as of midnight, June 28, 2013.

IT IS SO AGREED AND STIPULATED.
